A fun, hands-on workshop for anyone who would like to try working with glass.

Learn how to cut coloured and dichroic glass into some unique and stunning pieces of jewellery.

We will discuss the types of glass, safety and basic techniques for handling and cutting and then

you will be designing and assembling between 4-8 pieces each. Glass needs 8-12 hours in the kiln,

so the tutor will fire your pieces after the session and they will be ready the following week, when

you will be delighted at the transformation they have undergone in the kiln.
